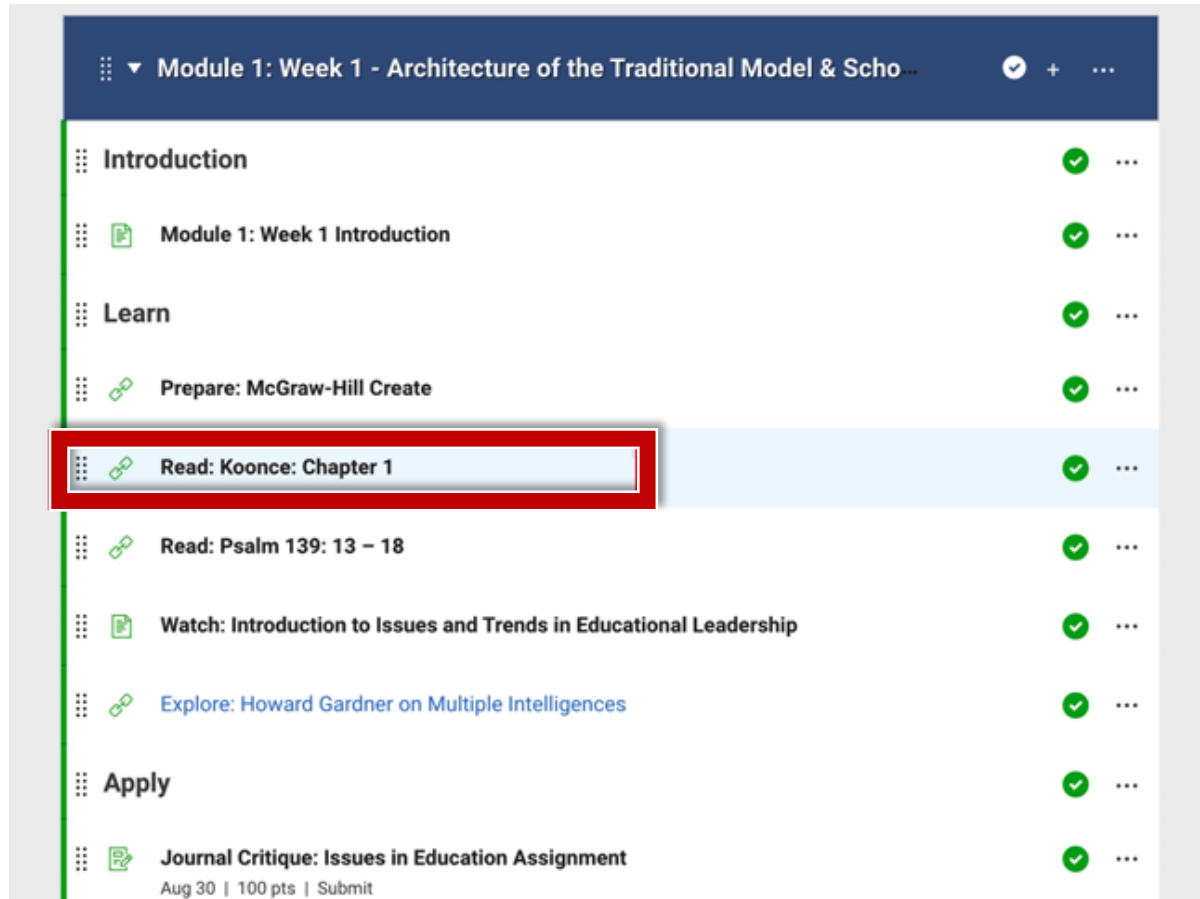

Step 1

Log into your Canvas course. Click on the Reading Link from the weekly module that you wish to access.





Step 2

If prompted, click to open your CREATE eBook in a new window.
